My Dear People,

Today's theme on the readings: **KEEP HOLY THE SABBATH**

There's no better way to deepen our Lenten practice than to review the Ten Commandments. The first three, having to do with our right relationship to God, get the most ink. The one we busy people probably have the most problem with is keeping holy the Sabbath.

If we take this commandment literally, babies will go undiapered and dishes will stay on the table, or perhaps meals will not be served. The sick will go unattended and nothing that has anything to do with physical labor will be done. Is mental labor really work? How about changing that dirty diaper (poor baby!)?

We need to depend on God to discern how to observe real Sabbath time in our lives. The point of this commandment is that God has given us a great gift: one whole day per week when we are free to rest, worship God, sing, feast, love, and rejoice. As Psalm 19 proclaims: "The law of the LORD is perfect, / refreshing the soul" (19:8). Our Sabbath rest is a great gift, to be received from God with joy, not with nitpicking.

As Jesus fasted for 40 days in the desert, the Church traditionally fasts during Lent. A form of bodily prayer, fasting and abstinence in union with other Christians reminds us of our utter dependence on and love for God. A gesture of repentance, fasting is symbolic of a change of heart as we turn away from sin to live in fidelity to the Gospel.

**Lenten Regulations:**  
**Fasting:** Ages 18-59 fast on Ash Wednesday and Good Friday, limiting themselves to one full meal and two smaller meals each day, with no snacking between meals.  
**Abstinence:** Catholics age 14 and older abstain from meat on Ash Wednesday, Good Friday and all the Fridays of Lent.

Good Third Sunday of Lent to you. We have four weeks before Easter to awaken our spiritual essence and prepare to meet our risen Lord. The library can be an excellent resource for all of us in this endeavor. Here are two of our new books that may be especially helpful and enjoyable.

#### Signs of Life: 40 Catholic Customs And Their Biblical Roots,

by Dr. Scott Hahn. In his book, Dr. Hahn examines the biblical and traditional roots of many of our Catholic beliefs and practices. He also sheds light on often heard misconceptions about certain rituals and traditions. This looks to be a seriously useful aid in strengthening our understanding of our Catholic religion.

#### Catholicism for Dummies,

by Rev. John Trigilio Jr., and Rev. Kenneth Brighenti. If you want to know more about you Catholic faith, but need something a bit wider in scope than Dr. Hahn's book, this overall survey of the Church may be just the thing. The authors tackle everything about Catholicism from devotions to doctrines and from the Mass to meatless Fridays. This looks like a very fine and sometimes lighthearted reference source for more than just dummies.

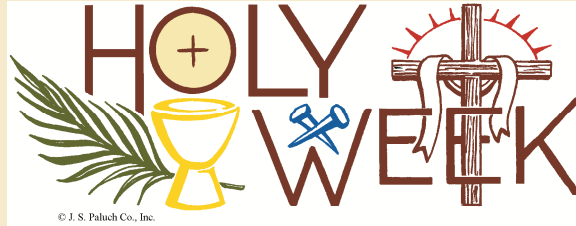

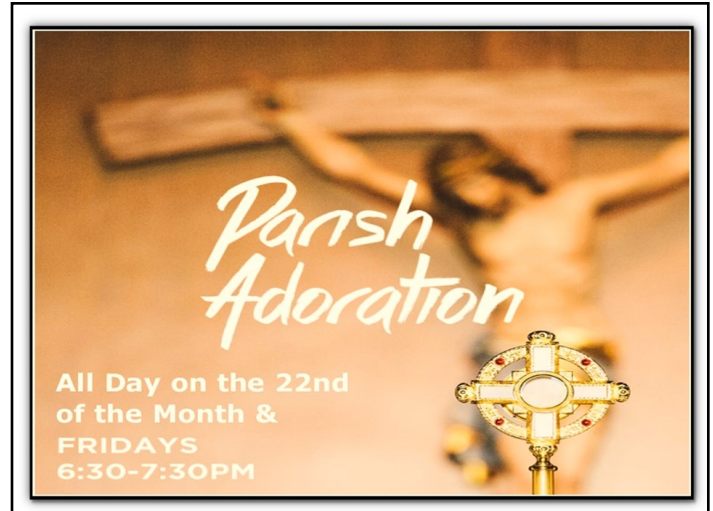


