Deacon Tony's September 25, 2022 Homily For the 26th Sunday in Ordinary Time

In our first reading, from the Minor Prophet Amos, he calls out the complacent in Zion who are living in the lap of luxury and could not be bothered by the collapse of the house of Joseph,

Complacency is a problem for people who are well off and self-sufficient with material things but lacking in spiritual amenities. It is always interesting to make observations of people from thousands of years past and find that man doesn't change much. We find that we have the same issues and that we need the same God to help us find our way home.

Amos considered that all people were equal in the eyes of God. That is why he was born in the Southern Kingdom but worked in the Northern Kingdom and he believed in RIGHTEOUSNESS over RITUAL.

After all, God's children need to work together and provide when needed.

That is why Paul was writing to Timothy; whom Paul had installed as the administrator to the Ephesians. The people had abandoned Timothy and Paul was encouraging him to go back to his NOBLE CONFESSION that he confessed when he was baptized and born anew.
