

The Library Corner

The Parish Library will be open today from 9:00 am to 1:00 pm.

The Catholic Church will celebrate the feast day of St. Mary Magdalene on Saturday, July 22. Her name comes from her home town of Magdala, a fishing village on the western shore of Lake Tiberias. She traveled with Jesus and the Apostles as they went from town to town announcing the Good News. In the Gospels, it is said that seven demons were cast out of her. Mary Magdalene appears by name in the Gospels twelve times and is present in the most dramatic moment of Jesus' life. She was with Jesus at Calvary and with Joseph of Arimathea placing the body of Jesus in the tomb. She is at the tomb on the morning of the first day and finds the stone rolled away. Later, she informs the Apostles, and she was the first person that Jesus appeared to, after His resurrection. That is why St Thomas Aquinas gave her the title of the Apostle to the Apostles. Pope Francis elevated the memory of Mary Magdalene to the status of feast on July 22, 2016 in order to stress the importance of this faithful disciple of Christ.

Why do we do that? Catholic Life Explained

Question:

Why do we use incense at Mass?

Answer:

The use of incense in religious ceremonies and worship is a practice that predates Christianity, and which is also found in many other religious traditions today.

Incense, which is made from resin infused with aromatic spices and oils, is one of those fundamentally human symbols that incorporates more than one of our senses, helping us to reflect on realities that transcend the everyday details of our lives.

The use of incense in the Church's liturgy — in the Mass, as well as in devotions to the Eucharist and the Liturgy of the Hours — is inspired by the use of incense in the Jewish tradition. In the writings of the Old Testament, we hear about incense being used in the worship of the temple, and Psalm 141 asks, "Let my prayer be incense before you; my uplifted hands an evening offering" (vs. 2). The image here is that, as the incense gently rises to heaven, our prayers also rise to God as something sweet and pleasant.

Another ancient use of incense that has also become part of our Catholic tradition is the idea that when we incense something, it's because it is something special or sacred. This is why the Book of the Gospel is incensed during the Liturgy of the Word and the bread, wine, priest celebrant, and congregation are incensed at the presentation of the gifts. To this, we can also add the incensing of the Blessed Sacrament during eucharistic adoration and benediction, and the body of the deceased at the end of the Mass of the Resurrection (the Funeral Mass).

First Reading


The prophet Isaiah assured the Israelites who were exiled in Babylon that God's word is reliable and purposeful. How might you help friends or family trust more in God?

On **July 22**, the 7th annual Camino de Santiago takes place at Santiago de Compostela Catholic Church in Lake Forest. This camino is a re-creation of the pilgrimage celebrated throughout the year by thousands around the world to the Shrine of Santiago de Compostela in Spain.

In addition to the usual three routes — 7 miles, 4 miles and the mini camino — a camino for families with young children has been added. It is a shorter version of the other routes, with activities and reflections for the youngest in the community.

This year's theme is: "I came so that they might have life and have it more abundantly" (John 10:10). The walk will focus on the pilgrims' reflections, prayers and activities in the real presence of Jesus in the Eucharist.

Camino de Santiago will be followed by a Holy Mass at **11:30 a.m.** (with Bishop Timothy Fryer as main presider), food, music, games, movies and fellowship. This is truly

an event filled with love, humility, fun, fellowship, service and faith.
