Today's theme on the readings: BAPTISMAL DEATH AND RESURRECTION

As we celebrate the Baptism of the Lord, we also honor our own baptism as our initiation into the Christian life and community. In the Gospel, the baptism of Jesus, with his immersion and then emergence from the water, points to his later submission to God at his death, and his emergence from the grave at his resurrection. This pattern of death and resurrection is our path too, as followers of Jesus. Throughout life, often in small ways, we learn to surrender our limited and self-centered agendas. This surrender often feels like death. The sacrament of Baptism ritually enacts this pattern to remind us of Jesus' death and resurrection, so that we too might embrace the deaths and resurrections of our own lives. As Jesus emerged from the water, he encountered his Father and the Holy Spirit. Like Jesus, we can know we are God's beloved, empowered by the Spirit.





The St. Thomas More Parish Library staff would like to wish all our parishioners a Happy Baptism of the Lord Sunday. The Parish Library will not be open today.

Today the Catholic Church celebrates the Feast of the Baptism of the Lord. Pope Pius XII commemorated this event and instituted it in 1955 as a separate liturgical observance. This event takes on the importance of a second creation in which the entire Trinity intervened. The Father's voice from heaven shows that Jesus is the eternal Son, and descent of the Holy Spirit in the form of a dove shows the Trinitarian nature of our divine God. Our true and unique God, the Father, the Son and the Holy Spirit shows Himself in Christ, through Him, with Him and in Him. As Catholics, we know that Baptism is the first Holy Sacrament.




NEW BIBLE STUDY! First Corinthians: The Church and the Christian Community




MEN'S RETREAT

READING OF SACRED SCRIPTURE

A partial indulgence is granted to the faithful, who with the veneration due the divine word make a spiritual reading from Sacred Scripture.


A plenary indulgence is granted, if this reading is continued for at least one half an hour.

SUGGESTION

This year, Sunday, January 23 is the Sunday of the Word of God. Pope Francis in 2020 decreed that the Third Sunday of Ordinary Time will henceforth be considered as the Sunday of the Word of God. Although this indulgence can be obtained at anytime throughout the year, this is a good day for you to dedicate 30 minutes to reading of the Sacred Scriptures. You can read any part of the Bible. Fr. Eugene Lee suggests that all parishioners of St. Thomas More read the Book of Acts from the beginning for a minimum of 30 minutes. The beginning of Acts describes the beginning of the Church after the Ascension of Jesus. It speaks about the HOLY SPIRIT'S action at the beginning. We too here at STM pray for the fire of the HOLY SPIRIT to continue raging in our hearts.

CONDITIONS FOR RECEIVING A PLENARY INDULGENCE

- 1. Do the prescribed work.
- 2. Receive Holy Communion within several days (before or after) of the indulgenced act.
- 3. Go to confession within several days (before or after) the indulgenced act
- 4. Pray for the Pope. An Our Father, Hail Mary, and Glory Be can suffice.
- 5. Be free from attachment to all sin, even venial sin.







A MODEL FOR OUR PRAYER LIFE

The Advent/Christmas cycle that began on November 28 ends with the Baptism of the Lord. We likely have an image in our minds (based on details from the Gospels and works of art) of what that scene looked like. We might wonder, "Who else was there and who wasn't?" No disciples were present because Jesus had not yet begun his ministry. They would have to wait until the Transfiguration to hear a similar message. However, the three persons of the Blessed Trinity are accounted for: the Father (the voice from heaven), the Son Jesus, and the Holy Spirit. Interestingly, Luke alone notes that it was after Jesus had been baptized and while he was praying that the voice was heard. All of the Gospels show Jesus praying at turning points in his ministry; this is but the first example of Jesus' need to root himself in prayer throughout his life—a model for us to follow.

ON THE CUSP OF A NEW CREATION

It was on the Fourth Sunday of Advent this past December that we first heard of the two cousins, John and Jesus, meeting. Then it was in the womb of their mothers, Elizabeth and Mary. Now the cousins meet again on the shore of the Jordan River. John is already well known—so much so that people had begun to wonder if he was the long-awaited Messiah. Jesus, on the other hand, is about to begin his ministry. One could say that Jesus entered the waters of the Jordan as a private person and came out of them as a public one. The voice from heaven left no doubt about that. As we come to the end of the Christmas season our readings echo Isaiah and Titus (see Advent and Christmas Day readings) and together with today's Psalm 104 they point us to Pentecost. We are on the cusp of a new creation.

JOHN THE BAPTIST: PATRON SAINT OF LITURGICAL MINISTERS?

John the Baptist was what we might call today a "social influencer." People paid attention to what he had to say. And what he said affected the choices people made. Yet today's Gospel reminds us of John the Baptist's ultimate goal: "One mightier than I is coming." The Baptizer walks the fine line between drawing attention to himself with his fiery preaching and then re-directing that attention to Jesus, the "beloved Son." John the Baptist could be considered the "patron saint" of those who minister as lectors, extraordinary ministers of the eucharist, cantors, greeters, acolytes, and musicians. Isn't John's teaching a good goal for a liturgical (or any!) minister? Root-

ed in the graces of their own baptism, ministers must be skilled and confident enough to draw people's attention (or, at least, not turn them off!) and then gradually re-focus that attention on Jesus. It is a dynamic and awesome responsibility.
